Dear Friends, You will recall that last week I explained that it would be necessary to make some adjustments to our parish mass schedule primarily due to the reduction in the number of available priests.

Rather suddenly and unexpectedly, I have found myself as the only full-time priest in the parish; and while I want to provide the best possible level of pastoral service to our parishioners, the reality is that one person can only do so much - particularly with the number of funerals we have in the parish.

This week I met with the Parish Council and consulted with many parishioners to explore the best ways of meeting the needs of the parish. I would like to propose a draft schedule of masses, beginning this Monday morning.

Many people felt that having the morning mass at 10am rather than 9.30am would be better and I am inclined to agree. So, on a trial basis, from tomorrow, our morning masses will be at 10am and we will have evening mass in St. Patrick's on Mondays at 7.30pm.

At the weekend, I propose having two Vigil Masses - one in Patrick's at 5pm and the other in St. Brigid's at 6:30pm. This will hopefully make things easier for those who are physically unable to make it to St. Patrick's.

Conscious of the long history of St. Malachy's, Ballykilbeg, I propose having 9am mass there on the first Sunday of every month. St. Colmcille's will continue to be available for funerals and school events.

I have had this new schedule printed at the back of the bulletins for clarity. It may be helpful to cut it out and keep it at home.

Change is difficult and it can take time to get used to new schedules, but as I said last week, nothing is written in stone. I hope that we can try this new timetable for a while and see how it goes, then adjust it as necessary. I would like to thank all those who have expressed their views to me – particularly the Parish Council and Deacon Jackie Breen.

As well as being a timely reminder for us to pray for and encourage vocations to the priesthood, these changes offer me as your Parish Priest an opportunity to reaffirm my desire to serve the people of the parish with willingness and availability.

Once again, can I say how grateful I am for your warm welcome, your kindness and prayerful support since I came to the parish. Let's move forward together with faith and confidence in God's abiding presence.
